

### What is Infertility?

Infertility is defined as the inability to conceive after 12 months of trying to become pregnant. Approximately 30% of the Nigerian population is affected by some related infertility issue. There are many reasons couples face challenges with conception.

## **Causes of Infertility**

- Harmful lifestyle choices including smoking, drinking or substance abuse
- High rate of adolescent sexual exposure, unwanted pregnancy and post-abortion damage
- High rate of secondary infertility that stems from infections after birth
- Fibroids are very common and up to 50% of women develop significant adhesions following myomectomy
- Poor access to healthcare for the management of STIs
- Poor semen quality
- Age-related infertility

#### What is the IVF process?

In vitro fertilization is a process by which an egg is fertilized by sperm outside the body that is, in vitro meaning "in glass". IVF is globally recognized as one of the most effective treatments to address infertility.

IVF is recommended when women face challenges such as problems with the fallopian tubes or when it has been established that there are issues with the man's sperm quality. The process involves the monitoring and stimulation of a woman's ovulation cycle,







collecting the eggs directly from the ovaries and letting treated sperm fertilize the eggs in a medical laboratory under very specialized conditions.

After a 5-day incubation period, the embryo is transferred into the woman's uterus. A pregnancy test is done two weeks after transfer.
